- EPF FY 23-24: \$15.25 M + \$500,000 for Carbon Sequestration Projects
- Addition of USDA Climate Smart Commodities Funding
- Tentative timeline
 - Round 8 RFP Release: February/March 2024
 - Round 8 Applications Due: June 2024
 - Award Round 8 CRF projects during Climate Week 2024









NYS Connects: Climate Smart Farms and Forests

- Partners: DEC Lands & Forests, AGM, Cornell, ESF, Syracuse University
- Awarded: \$60M
- Main Program Goals:
 - 1. Direct assistance to farmers for climate smart BMPs to reduce GHG emissions on-farm
 - 2. Include underserved farmers
 - 3. Measurement, Monitoring, Reporting, & Verification (MMRV) of GHG reductions





NYS Connects: Climate Smart Farms and Forests

- Partner Deliverables:
 - DEC Lands & Forests direct assistance to landowners for climate smart forest management through Regenerate NY
 - AGM direct assistance to landowners for climate smart agricultural practices through CRF and new pilots
 - Cornell Measurement, Monitoring, Reporting, and Verification (MMRV) research and tool development, outreach to underserved partners
 - ESF technical assistance for climate smart forest management
 - Syracuse University development of markets for climate smart commodities





Direct Assistance through AGM

- Pilot for Payment for Methane Monitoring and Reporting \$2M
 - payments to farmer and SWCD for collection, tracking, and reporting of methane emission reduction on cover and flare systems or existing Anaerobic Digester Systems (ADS)
- Pilot for Adaptive Management for Methane and Nitrous Oxide Reductions - \$2M
 - Support farmer use of adaptive management tools for precision feed mgmt. Incentivize farmers use of Net Carbohydrate and Protein System (CNCPS) tool to predict requirements for feed utilization, animal performance, and nutrient excretion for diary and beef cattle which integrates predication equations for GHG emissions.

Direct Assistance through AGM

- Alternative Manure Management \$10.5M
 - Cost-share for alternative manure mgmt. This will be incorporated into CRF R8/R9.
- Adoption of Climate Smart Practices for agroforestry, silvopasture, urban agriculture, and soil health - \$10M
 - Cost-share for soil health practices. This will be incorporated into CRF R8/R9.





How will this impact State Committee and SWCD work?

- Increased funding in CRF R8 & R9 to enhance alternative manure management and soil health tracks
- New pilots with financial support for data collection and use of precision feed management tools
- Increased partnerships with CCE and SWCDs for outreach to underserved farmers for technical assistance and information about cost-share opportunities

Environmental Bond Act

2022 Clean Water, Clean Air, and Green Jobs Bond Act

- Passed by voters November 2022
- \$4.2 billion to support environmental improvements across the state

Current Status

- Funding sub-allocations
- Project proposals sent to the Bond Act leadership and will be selected based on available funding

- Potential increased funding in future AgNPS and CRF Rounds

- Increased funding for BMP Implementation expanding on core EPF funding programs
